

3RD DOSE VS. BOOSTER

3RD ADDITIONAL DOSE

- Individuals who are moderately to severely immunocompromised should consider a 3rd dose
- Talk with your healthcare provider about your medical condition and if getting a 3rd dose is appropriate for you
- It is especially important to speak with your provider if you are looking for a 3rd dose of Moderna as the dosage is different.

28 days after primary series
Pfizer or Moderna

MODERNA OR PFIZER BOOSTER DOSE

- 65+ and residents in long-term care settings
 - 50-64 with underlying medical conditions
 - 18-49 with underlying medical conditions
 - 18-64 who are at increased risk for COVID-19 because of occupational or institutional setting
 - Pfizer = same dose as 1st & 2nd dose
 - Moderna = half dose as 1st and 2nd dose
- 6 months after primary series

"MIX AND MATCH" COVID-19 BOOSTER DOSE

The CDC has approved the use of "mix and match" covid-19 booster doses. This means you may choose which vaccine you receive as your booster shot so long as you have completed the primary series of either Pfizer or Moderna or received the single dose of J&J. To check eligibility see below.

J&J BOOSTER

- Those 18+ who have received a dose of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine are eligible to get a booster after 2 months of receiving their first dose of J&J.
- Same dosage as J&J single dose.
